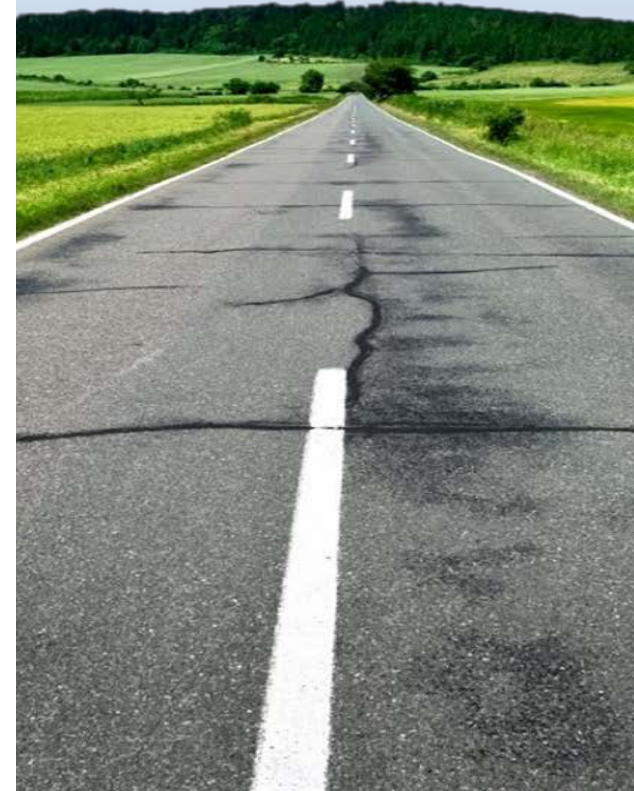

About Reentry:

The primary goal of the Reentry Program is to connect returning citizens to needed services. Reentry coordinators understand the unique challenges returning citizens face when coming home to their community.

The program links returning citizens with services specific to their needs in order to reduce the likelihood of additional criminal behavior. Returning citizens determine their own progress and actions. Through staff assistance they are encouraged to make positive changes while finding their way on the path toward success and independence.

Pre-Release Services:

Reentry Services may include meeting with inmates preparing for release. These meetings may be face-to-face or by video conference to inform inmates about the wide array of services available to them upon release.

Meetings can include the inmate's case manager. Inmates are encouraged to ask any questions they may have regarding their release planning needs.
